Any elected official who contracts or submits an invoice to the City for payment of services is required to abstain from the vote of said payment, and execute an "Affidavit of City Official Interested in Claim" form prior to receiving payment pursuant to MN Statute 471.87:

471.87 PUBLIC OFFICERS, INTEREST IN CONTRACT; PENALTY.

Except as authorized in section [123B.195](#) or [471.88](#), a public officer who is authorized to take part in any manner in making any sale, lease, or contract in official capacity shall not voluntarily have a personal financial interest in that sale, lease, or contract or personally benefit financially therefrom. Every public officer who violates this provision is guilty of a gross misdemeanor.

471.88 EXCEPTIONS.

Subdivision 1. Coverage.

The governing body of any port authority, seaway port authority, economic development authority, watershed district, soil and water conservation district, town, school district, hospital district, county, or city, by unanimous vote, may contract for goods or services with an interested officer of the governmental unit in any of the following cases.

Subd. 5. Contract with no bids required.

A contract for which competitive bids are not required by law.

WORKSHOP MINUTES
SEPTEMBER 23, 2020**

1. CALL TO ORDER

Mayor Wallen called the meeting to order at 5:00 p.m.

2. ROLL CALL

Council Members present: Seth Hansen, Paul Knier, Mike Wallen, and Scott Zettervall. Also present: City Administrator Clay Wilfahrt, Finance Director Deb Wegeleben, City Engineer Layne Otteson, Police Chief Joel Scharf, Deputy Police Chief Matt Hayen, Community Development Director Hanna Klimmek, City Clerk Gina Wolbeck, and Big Lake Student Liaison Ella Dotzler.

3. PROPOSED AGENDA

Council Member Knier motioned to adopt the proposed Agenda as presented. Seconded by Council Member Zettervall, unanimous ayes, Agenda adopted.

4. BUSINESS

4A. Full-time Fire Chief Budget Discussion

Clay Wilfahrt discussed staffing at the Big Lake Volunteer Fire Department which has served the Big Lake community for over 100 years. The Department is comprised of approximately 35 – 40 paid, on-call firefighters. The leadership structure consists of one Chief, one Assistant Chief, five Captains, two Lieutenants, one Quartermaster, and one Training Coordinator. The Assistant Chief is paid \$4,800 annually, and the Chief is paid \$8,400 annually along with payment for ancillary work such as court appearances and development review. The Department also began using a duty officer to respond to non-emergency calls to avoid paying a larger number of people to respond to a call. The current system has worked well for a number of years. Recently, there have been some issues with the way things operate at the Department. The Department logs 10,000 hours of response time, which is equivalent to 5 FTE's. The budget for the department is approximately \$500,000 annually and equipment, inspections, and regulations are becoming increasingly complex. Wilfahrt also noted that budget and capital planning processes are best handled by someone with experience not always available in a pool of paid, on-call firefighters. Managing 40 people and handling day-to-day administration of the Department is challenging, particularly if leaders don't possess training or experience. Due to these reasons, Staff has contemplated the idea of implementing a full-time Fire Chief position. Wilfahrt reviewed fire staffing of all MN Cities in the population range of 8,000 to 14,000 residents and found that 19 of the 36 cities that have their own Fire Department have a full-time Fire Chief. Wilfahrt expressed that the information is not perfect since the Department not only covers the City, it also covers the Township areas. The total population of the Fire District is approximately 20,000. Wilfahrt also noted that Zimmerman, Elk River, and Monticello all have full-time Chiefs, while Becker does not. Wilfahrt reviewed options the Board can consider including hiring a full-time Chief,

remain as is, or divest some administrative duties in other ways, and reviewed an analysis of costs and benefits of making a change as objectively as possible. Wilfahrt noted that what we have developed so far is a starting point for a conversation, but also recognized the need to understand the opinions of others. Wilfahrt noted that he reached out to Township representation on the Fire Board's Personnel Committee and the Township prefers to wait to have this discussion until after the election. Wilfahrt noted that if the Township is receptive to have the discussion, we would be holding a number of conversations with the Fire Department. We will develop a quick survey asking officers and firefighters what they think about this initiative. We will also be attending a full-department meeting to discuss this with them. A member of the Township Board will be invited to attend to listen in. This meeting will not be intended to persuade anyone, but instead to understand if there is support for the position among those in the Department. Wilfahrt noted that ultimately, the Fire Board will be the body that makes the decision. As long as the other steps seem to suggest an interest in this position, Staff will bring this forward to the Fire Board. Wilfahrt reviewed budgeting for the position, and clarified that action will be required to appoint a Fire Chief, stressing that by leaving it in the budget does not mean we will move forward with appointment of the position.

Council Member Hansen stated that while he is choosing to abstain from discussion on the matter, he expressed the excessive amount of time he is giving as Chief which he feels is unsustainable.

Council Member Knier stated that it is not a question of wanting our town to be as safe as possible, but felt that his thoughts lay with the Township in that we should wait until after the election to decide. Knier stated that he feels the hiring of a full-time Fire Chief is an idea that is ahead of its time and noted that we should not rush it through. Knier also stated that the Fire Board makes the decision and we should leave it out of the budget this year as we have other issues that need to be addressed.

Council Member Zettervall stated that he feels the current work load for the Chief position is unsustainable long term and discussed funding for a full-time Chief. Zettervall discussed savings and income streams that we should consider when budgeting for the position, noting that there is an urgency to be prepared to do something quickly. Zettervall also discussed the option of leaving the funding out of the 2021 budget and designating the money that was budgeted for 2020 for the position in the reserve fund. Deb Wegeleben stressed that Staff cannot guarantee that the funds will remain available for 2021, noting that in a perfect world she would be on board with designating these funds for use in the next year's budget, but stated that we do not fully know what the financial impact COVID will have on the City's budget in the coming months. Zettervall stated that he would prefer to leave the dollars earmarked for this specific use. Mayor Wallen discussed that if we don't budget for it then we would need to do a budget amendment and questioned what the impact of that would be. Wegeleben indicated that it can impact our bond rating as we would need to use unreserved fund balances which could be a violation of our financial policy. Zettervall noted that they would look back at discussions we have had on the subject. Discussion was held about possibly budgeting a lesser amount. Wegeleben noted that we can budget a lesser amount but cautioned Council that we need to maintain a 50% unreserved fund balance. Zettervall stated that he is open to leaving the allocation there and budget \$50,000 for 2021.

Mayor Wallen stressed that this is a bigger position than just the Fire Chief. It's Emergency Management also and that having someone on staff during the day would be a huge advantage. Wallen stated that the world is so unsettled right now, especially in regard to Emergency Management, noting that we have been blessed to live in a safe community, but issues are moving further out from the City and we need to be prepared. We keep pushing this topic to the side, and feels that we would be doing a disservice to our citizens to just wait until things get worse. Wallen stated that he would like to leave the dollars in the 2021 budget, and follow through with the necessary steps to implement the full-time position. Wallen urged Council that we need to be pro-active, not re-active. Wallen discussed the City of Zimmerman full-time Fire Chief position that has worked out very well for that community. Wallen discussed that if we collectively decide on a lesser amount to budget for 2021, the conversation still needs to continue. Council Member Knier again stated that he struggles with making such a big move in restructuring the whole department before the election, but understands where Seth is coming from. Council Member Hansen questioned how we would be changing the whole structure of the Department. Knier discussed his concern that hiring a full-time Chief could lead into the need for additional full-time staff. Council Members discussed the need to give future Councils the tools necessary to implement needs. Council Member Zettervall noted that the current amount budgeted for the full-time position in the Preliminary 2021 Budget is \$149,336 and asked if it is realistic to reduce that amount to \$62,500, and not make a decision to move forward with the actual position at this time. Knier asked for clarification on where the funds budgeted for this position in 2020 are going to be held. Wegeleben reviewed budgeting processes, fund balances, and collection of property taxes. At year end, as long as we are above the 50% threshold of expenditures, we can transfer those funds to the CIP fund and they can be used for whatever needs Council deems appropriate. Wegeleben stressed that if we don't receive our final tax payment, funds in the reserves will be used to fund services for our citizens. Council directed Staff to budget \$62,500 in the 2021 budget so that the next Boards can make the decision whether or not to implement the full-time position. Wegeleben explained that the Preliminary budget being considered at the regular meeting tonight will have the full cost of the position, but the budget amount can be reduced when Council approves the final budget in December. Council Member Hansen abstained from giving direction on funding for the position, but stressed that the Department needs to move forward, noting that they do the best they can with what they have.

Council also directed Staff to bring back options on how to reallocate the lower budget numbers.

4B. DNR Lake Land Transfer Discussion

Layne Otteson discussed vacant land that is currently owned by the State of MN noting that they contacted the City to see if there is interest in purchasing the land. The 0.71 acre of land has lake-frontage on both sides and is land locked with private property owners to the east and west. The land is approximately 5 to 25 feet wide with vegetation growth including tall grasses, wildflowers, shrubs, and trees. The shore appears to be slowly eroding away and has a vertical bank that is about 2 feet tall. Otteson noted that in 2007, the City constructed channel improvements in this area. The channel provides navigation from one lake to the other. Recent observation found the channel walls are separating and are in need of repair in the next few

years. It was also noted that shore stabilization will be needed along the length of the property. Otteson noted that future channel repair and stabilization costs are not estimated at this time. The costs to repair the steel channel walls would likely be required of the City regardless who owns the land. Future costs to protect the shoreline could be significant, but grants could be pursued for all work and likely cover a majority of the costs.

Council Member Hansen clarified that the City doesn't have control of the water area.

Council Member Knier questioned if it would work to have the adjacent properties own the land, while giving the City an easement to access the channel improvements. Knier also questioned if we would be taking on liability by owning the land. Council Member Hansen stated that by taking ownership, we can preserve the two separate lakes.

Council Member Zetervall stated that if ownership goes to adjacent property owners, it could limit our ability to maintain the channel area.

Mayor Wallen questioned who is responsible for the channel. Otteson noted that the City did the project in 2007 and would be responsible for maintenance. Otteson also stressed that if we don't preserve the land the channel will erode. Wallen discussed the need to acquire the property and establish both a long-term and short-term plan.

Council directed Staff to continue to research options available for preserving the channel and potential future costs, to continue discussions with the State on options to take ownership of the land, and to bring back an update to Council in the near future.

4C. New Ideas Discussion – No other discussion.

Council Member Knier asked what the process will be for designating an official newspaper and which newspaper would be best to publish City notices in. Wilfahrt informed Council that the City designates its official newspaper at the first meeting of the year. Wilfahrt also discussed that Staff will provide information on costs and options available to the City for publication.

5. OTHER – No other.

6. ADJOURN

1. CALL TO ORDER

Mayor Mike Wallen called the meeting to order at 6:00 p.m.

2. PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE

The Pledge of Allegiance was recited.

3. ROLL CALL

Council Members present: Seth Hansen, Paul Knier, Mike Wallen, and Scott Zettervall. Also present: City Administrator Clay Wilfahrt, Finance Director Deb Wegeleben, Community Development Director Hanna Klimmek, City Engineer Layne Otteson, Deputy Police Chief Matt Hayen, City Clerk Gina Wolbeck, City Planner Lucinda Meyers, Big Lake Student Liaison Ella Dotzler, and Consultant City Planner Kevin Shay from Landform.

4. OPEN FORUM

Mayor Wallen opened the Open Forum at 6:01 p.m. No one came forward. Mayor Wallen closed the Open Forum at 6:02 p.m.

5. PROPOSED AGENDA

Council Member Zettervall motioned to adopt the proposed Agenda as presented. Seconded by Council Member Knier, unanimous ayes, Agenda adopted.

6. CONSENT AGENDA

Council Member Hansen motioned to approve the Consent Agenda with the removal of item no. 6D for separate consideration. Seconded by Council Member Zettervall, unanimous ayes, Consent Agenda approved. The Consent Agenda consists of: 6A. Approve List of Claims, 6B.

Approve Council Workshop Minutes of September 9, 2020, 6C. Approve Council Meeting Minutes of September 9, 2020, ~~6D. Approve Resolution Appointing Election Judges for the November 3, 2020 General Election~~, 6E. Approve Personnel Policy Amendment Changing Core Hours, 6F. Approve Resolution No. 2020-75 approving a Therapeutic Massage License to Yan Liu to operate at Lily's Massage Located at 635 Rose Drive, Suite 2, 6G. Approve Letter of Understanding with the International Union of Engineers, Local 49 Regarding On-Call Procedures, 6H. Set Special Joint Powers Board Meeting at 4:30 p.m. on Wednesday, October 14, 2020 for a development application submitted by Cargill, Inc. for the property located at 20021 176th Street NW, 6I. 6D. Approve Resolution Appointing Election Judges for the November 3, 2020 General Election

Mayor Wallen indicated that two additional judges have been added to the list since the packet was distributed on Friday.

Council Member Hansen motioned to approve Resolution No. 2020-76 appointing Election Judges for the November 3, 2020 General Election. Seconded by Council Member Zettervall, unanimous ayes, motion carried.

7. BUSINESS

7A. Liberty Bank Development Application – Site Plan, Variance and Conditional Use Permit

Kevin Shay reviewed the planners report for the development application submitted by Miller Architects on behalf of Liberty Bank Minnesota seeking approval on site plan review, a Conditional Use Permit for a changeable electronic sign, and a Variance request to exceed the maximum square footage allowed for a changeable electronic sign. The application is for a 2,813 square foot bank with four drive-through lanes consisting of three teller lanes and one ATM lane. The subject site is located on a 1.2 acre undeveloped parcel that lies west of Casey's General Store and east of the Northstar Professional Building. The property is zoned B-3 General Business and guided for Business. Shay reviewed sidewalk areas, landscaping requirements, utility hook-ups, storm water management, building design standards, lighting, and proposed signage. Shay reviewed that the Big Lake City Code allows for one Changeable Electronic Sign in the B-3 district through a Conditional Use Permit, subject to specific criteria. Shay also discussed that the Applicant has requested a Variance to exceed the allowed sign area for a changeable electronic sign from the allowed 24 sq. ft. to 66 sq. ft. and noted that the required Variance criteria has not been met by the Applicant. Shay indicated that Staff is not supportive of the

Variance based on the findings. The Applicant has not proved that any hardship exists or that any unique situation exists. The Big Lake Planning Commission held a public hearing on this application on September 8, 2020 and the Applicant was the only one to speak at the hearing and had no issues with Staff's recommendation or conditions. The Planning Commission discussed the proposed sign Variance and whether the size was appropriate. It was concluded that a Variance was not warranted as there is no practical difficulty. The Planning Commission further discussed if the sign ordinance should be reviewed to see if an amendment to allow larger signage would be appropriate. The Planning Commission unanimously recommended approval of the Site Plan and Conditional Use Permit and denial of the Variance.

Council Member Zettervall reviewed discussions at the Planning Commission noting that their recommendation to deny the Variance was based on the lack of a practical difficulty.

Council Member Knier motioned to approve Resolution No. 2020-77 approving the Site Plan and Conditional Use Permit and denying the Variance for the Liberty Bank project located at 730 Humboldt Drive. Seconded by Council Member Zettervall, unanimous ayes, motion carried.

7B. Ordinance Amendment – Chapter 14 (Right of Way Management)

Lucinda Meyers reviewed past discussions of proposed amendments to the City's Right of Way Ordinance during workshops held on May 27, 2020 and July 22, 2020. The proposed amendments establish provisions for the regulation of small cell wireless facility equipment and street light fixtures and poles. Meyers reviewed additional changes to the language as recommended by the City Attorney's Office since the language was last reviewed by Council. Meyers also noted that the Small Cell Wireless Facility Permit fee will be considered when Council adopts the 2021 City Fee Schedule. Meyers also informed Council that the City does have the option to require a Conditional Use Permit (CUP) for placement of this type of equipment in single-family residential districts.

Council Member Knier discussed CUP permitting in single-family residential neighborhoods and asked how other communities are enacting rules in these types of districts. Knier also questioned if by implementing the CUP requirement, has this discouraged telecommunication companies to not place small cell wireless facility equipment in single-family neighborhoods in other communities. Knier also stated that the dangers of the technology far outweigh the benefits of faster speeds. Knier stated that he would rather we table this item for further discussion on implementing a CUP process, noting that he wants to keep it out of residential neighborhoods due to negative health effects.

Council Member Zettervall explained that a CUP process allows a city to put conditional uses on the permit. Zettervall stated that he would rather Council approve the Ordinance

as currently written so that the aesthetics requirements are adopted, and to direct Staff to bring back further discussion on adding in the CUP requirement, basically approve now and amend later. Zettervall also clarified that this is not a 5G discussion, but an overall small cell wireless discussion.

Mayor Wallen discussed that the concern seems to be on single-family properties, noting that we should give residents a voice in making those decisions. Wallen stated that he would like to get the language as presented approved, but would also like to vet out the CUP option after.

Council Member Zettervall motioned to approve Ordinance No. 2020-15 amending Chapter 14 of the Big Lake City Code regulating small cell wireless facility equipment and associated street light fixtures and poles installed in the right-of-way, and approve summary publication Resolution No. 2020-78. Seconded by Council Member Hansen, unanimous ayes, motion carried.

Council also directed Staff to bring back to further discussion to the Planning Commission on establishing a CUP process for single-family residential neighborhoods.

7C. Preliminary 2021 Tax Levy and Economic Development Authority Levy

Deb Wegeleben reviewed the 2021 General Fund budget concept numbers. The 2021 General Fund preliminary property tax levy of \$4,695,345 includes the General Fund Levy of \$3,520,725 and the Debt Levy of \$1,174,620, which is an increase of \$259,392 over the 2020 final tax levy. The 2021 Big Lake Economic Development Authority preliminary property tax levy of \$130,000 is the same amount that was levied in 2020. The combined preliminary tax levies for 2021 will be \$4,825,345, which is an increase of 5.68% or \$259,392 over 2020. Wegeleben noted that the City Tax Rate will decrease by .86% to 49.76%. Wegeleben also noted that the 2021 Preliminary General Fund Balanced Budget is set at \$5,560,546, which is an increase of 2.67% or \$144,483 from 2020.

Wegeleben informed Council and the public that the City has scheduled a hearing to allow for public input on the 2021 Budget and Levy at 6:00 p.m. during the regularly scheduled meeting on Wednesday, November 25, 2020 with a continuation meeting date of Monday November 30th, which will only be held if needed. This will allow council time to reflect on comments received during the public input hearing and make necessary changes prior to setting the final payable 2021 Property Tax Levy on December 9, 2020.

Council Member Zettervall asked for clarification that once we approve the Preliminary Budget, the Preliminary tax rate will decrease by .86%. Wegeleben concurred that the Preliminary tax rate would be set at 49.76% which is a .86% reduction, but that it can be adjusted down when the final budget is adopted in December.

Council Member Hansen motioned to approve Resolution No. 2020-79 adopting the Preliminary 2021 Tax Levy for the City of Big Lake. Seconded by Council Member Knier, unanimous ayes, motion carried.

Council Member Hansen motioned to approve Resolution No. 2020-80 adopting the Preliminary 2021 Tax Levy for the Big Lake Economic Development Authority. Seconded by Council Member Zettervall, unanimous ayes, motion carried.

7D. Proclamation – Manufacturer’s Week (October 1 – 7, 2020)

Hanna Klimmek discussed the upcoming Manufacturer’s Week which is being recognized the week of October 1 – 7, 2020 throughout Minnesota. Klimmek also indicated that due to COVID precautions, we will not be scheduling any in-person manufacturing tours. Mayor Wallen read aloud a Proclamation proclaiming October 1 – 7, 2020 as Manufacturer’s Week in the City of Big Lake.

Council Member Knier motioned to approve Resolution No. 2020-81 Proclaiming October 1 – 7, 2020 as Manufacturer’s Week in the City of Big Lake. Seconded by Council Member Zettervall, unanimous ayes, motion carried.

7E. Discontinuation of the Temporary Wage Increase for Non-Exempt Liquor Store Staff

Clay Wilfahrt discussed the history of the wage increase for all non-exempt liquor store staff due to the impact on operations the store has experienced during the COVID Pandemic. Wilfahrt noted that during this difficult time, Staff has been outstanding with their flexibility and commitment to the City and to customers of the store. Wilfahrt noted that the full-time Liquor Clerk and part-time Lead Liquor Clerk positions have now been filled along with several other part-time liquor clerk positions, and informed Council that Lake Liquor will be returning to pre-COVID business hours of Monday through Saturday 9:00 a.m. to 10:00 p.m. and Sundays 11:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m. beginning October 1, 2020. The Council had previously indicated that they wanted the temporary pay increase tied to hours of operation and noted that staffing vacancies are filled, that business has begun to stabilize, and the liquor store will not be receiving State or Federal compensation for the temporary pay increase as we had anticipated. Wilfahrt noted that Staff is recommending that the \$2.00 per hour temporary wage increase for non-exempt liquor store staff end effective September 27, 2020 which is the start of the next pay period. Council thanked the leadership at the store and all employees for their dedication during this difficult time.

Council Member Zettervall stated that he is glad we did the increase when we did.

Council Member Zettervall motioned to approve to discontinue the temporary pay increase of \$2.00 per hour for all non-exempt liquor store staff effective September 27, 2020. Seconded by Council Member Knier, unanimous ayes, motion carried.

7F. Monthly Department Reports

Deb Wegeleben provided a year-to-date financial report and provided an update on the City's outstanding debt. Wegeleben also announced that the 2021 Truth in Taxation Public Input Hearing will be held at 6:00 p.m. on Wednesday, November 25, 2020 during the regularly scheduled Council Meeting.

Mayor Wallen asked for an update on where we are at on delinquent water bills. Wegeleben noted that the amount has lowered somewhat since the last Workshop, but we still have a higher number than normal. Wegeleben informed Council that assessment notices will be sent out next week.

Clay Wilfahrt provided an update on the Municipal Liquor Store operations for August 2020 noting that the first in-store wine tasting was held since COVID started, reviewed the \$186 collected towards the Big Lake Fire Department through collection jars, and recapped the new hours of operation starting October 1, 2020. Wilfahrt also provided a year to date financial comparison between 2019 and 2020.

Hanna Klimmek provided an update on activities in the Community Development Department. Klimmek reviewed housing, commercial and redevelopment projects, and provided a year to date 2019/2020 permit activity comparison. Klimmek also noted that the Code Revision Taskforce held their 2nd meeting on September 15th, and reviewed that the BLEDA has decided it is time to commence with the Big Lake Branding and Identity Design Project and held their kick-off meeting on September 21st. The first action step for the project will be immersion and discovery. Klimmek also discussed that Assistant County Administrator Dan Weber met with the BLEDA at their September meeting to discuss the County's CARES Act funding, noting that the Big Lake business community has been awarded the most funds in the county with \$425,000 being allocated to our business community. Klimmek also discussed the September 18th Movie in the Park(ing) Lot event held at Lakeside Park, provided a Farmer's Market update, and reviewed activities in the Streets/Parks Division. The Street/Parks Department assisted with prepping the site area for the newly delivered Freedom Rock at Lakeside Park, and Klimmek reviewed fall maintenance being done on streets, overlays, and noted that work is transitioning into the winter season.

8. ADMINISTRATOR'S REPORT

Clay Wilfahrt discussed on-going union negotiations with LELS. Wilfahrt also discussed complaints the City has received on political signage on private property that is surrounded by razor wire that has been getting a lot of attention. The City Attorney has advised that we can only regulate where a political sign is placed, not what is displayed on or around the sign.

Mayor Wallen: Discussed the September BLEDA Meeting.

Council Member Hansen: Provided a CMRRPP Meeting update.

ACTION REQUESTED

By approving this item on the Consent Agenda, Council would be approving an Agreement to Distribute Federal Coronavirus Relief funds in the amount of \$35,000 for Big Lake Township.

BACKGROUND/DISCUSSION

Recently, Staff was asked if the City can act as the pass-through entity for a portion of Big Lake Township’s Federal Coronavirus Relief Funding to distribute to businesses who have been adversely affected by COVID-19. Staff had the City Attorney draft an agreement, and also verified with the City’s external Auditor that this is allowed.

To receive funds, eligible businesses must apply through the Township to receive approval by October 30, 2020. If approved by the Township, the City will then distribute the awarded grant amount to the eligible business. Businesses will be subject to the City’s guidelines and restrictions regarding the use of the Big Lake COVID-19 Emergency Grant Program and in compliance with the CARES Act.

FINANCIAL IMPACT

These funds will be used to offset the impact of COVID-19 to businesses.

STAFF RECOMMENDATION

Approve the Agreement to Distribute Cares Funds between the City of Big Lake and Big Lake Township for the distribution of a portion of the Township’s Federal Coronavirus Relief Funds.

AGREEMENT TO DISTRIBUTE CARES FUNDS

This Grant Agreement (“Agreement”) is made this __ day of _____, 2020, between the Township of Big Lake (“Township”) and City of Big Lake (“City”).

RECITALS

WHEREAS, the Township has received funds from the federal government through The CARES Act’s Coronavirus Relief Fund;

WHEREAS, according to guidance from the U.S. Treasury Department the CARES Act permits units of local government to transfer funds to another unit of government, therefore, the Township is able to transfer Coronavirus Relief Funds to the City;

WHEREAS, the Township desires to use the Coronavirus Relief Funds to support local businesses that were adversely effected during the pandemic, however, the Township requests the assistance of the City to facilitate the distribution of the funds;

WHEREAS, the City previously created its own emergency grant program and has been distributing funds to local businesses in need; and

WHEREAS, only businesses approved by the Township are eligible for the Township CARES funds through the City.

ACCORDINGLY, the parties hereto agree as follows:

1. The Grant Amount. Subject to the terms and conditions of this Agreement the Township agrees to grant the City Thirty Five Thousand and no/100th Dollars (\$35,000.00) (“Grant”).
2. Disbursement. To receive funds, eligible businesses must apply through the Township to receive approval by October 30, 2020. Then, if approved by the Township, the City will distribute a lump sum (“Business Grant”) to the eligible business. Businesses will be subject to the City’s guidelines and restrictions regarding the use of the Business Grant.
3. Federal and State Compliance. This Grant to the City and subsequent Business Grants must be in compliance the CARES Act, federal guidance from the U.S. Treasury Department, and state guidance from the Minnesota Management and Budget Agency including the COVID-19 Response Accountability Office. Because both the Township and the City are responsible for appropriate use of funds either party may: reduce a particular Business Grant amount; refuse to distribute a Business Grant; or otherwise modify a Business Grant for any reason.
4. Termination. This Agreement shall terminate on November 15, 2020. Either party may terminate this Agreement at any time by providing the other party 15 days written notice. This Agreement may terminate without notice in the event of a breach by either party.

- f. Entire Agreement. This Agreement constitutes the complete and exclusive statement of all mutual understandings between the parties with respect to this Agreement, superseding all prior or contemporaneous proposals, communications, and understandings, whether oral or written, concerning the Grant.
- g. Amendments. Any amendment to this Agreement must be in writing and will not be effective until it has been executed and approved by the same parties who executed and approved the original Agreement, or their successors in office.
- h. Headings. The headings appearing at the beginning of the several sections contained in this Agreement have been inserted for identification and reference purposes only and shall not be used in the construction and interpretation of this Agreement.

ACTION REQUESTED

By approving this item on the Consent Agenda, Council is approving the purchase of a 2017 Ford Expedition, and authorizing the sale by auction of a 2015 Ford Explorer, a 2009 Chevrolet Suburban, and a diesel Kawasaki Mule 4010.

BACKGROUND/DISCUSSION

On September 23rd, the 2016 Dodge Charger owned by the Big Lake Police Department was involved in a crash during the pursuit of a robbery suspect. Following the crash, the League of Minnesota Cities Trust declared the vehicle a total loss. This vehicle was purchased in March of this year for \$16,900. The adjuster stated the insurance proceeds will be close to this amount, and cover removing equipment and reinstalling it into another vehicle. In lieu of a new replacement, a 2017 Ford Expedition was located at a dealer in Chicago for used police vehicles. The vehicle has low miles, and is in excellent condition. It will serve as the replacement for the vehicle lost with a negotiated cost of \$17,400.

The Big Lake Police Department is also requesting authorization to dispose of by auction, a 2009 Chevrolet Suburban with 199,000 miles, and a diesel Kawasaki Mule with a snow blade. Both items were obtained from the Return to Duty Program and have served a useful purpose within the department, but are no longer needed. Their proceeds will be returned to the CIP Fund and used to offset any uncovered costs with the above vehicle replacement. Any remaining funds will be held for future needs.

We are also seeking authorization to dispose of by auction for City Hall a 2015 Ford Explorer with 113,000 miles. This vehicle has a repair need which is cost prohibitive to undertake given its projected value. In the 2021 CIP Budget, a retired 2017 Ford Explorer from the Police Department will serve as its replacement.

FINANCIAL IMPACT

A positive financial impact will occur with the purchase of a replacement vehicle, and the sale of two vehicles within the Police Department. A positive financial impact will also occur with the sale of the vehicle owned by City Hall.

STAFF RECOMMENDATION

Staff recommends Council approve the purchase of a 2017 Ford Expedition as presented, and authorize the sale of three vehicles (2 PD and 1 City Hall) at auction.

ACTION REQUESTED

By approving this item on the Consent Agenda, Council would be authorizing the Police Department to place an order for (2) Chevrolet Tahoe Police Package Sport Utility Vehicles.

BACKGROUND/DISCUSSION

The purchase of two replacement vehicles is included in the 2021 Capitol Improvement Budget. The Big Lake Police Department operates on a replacement cycle of 2 vehicles per year for two years, then the third year one. This dedicates 5 vehicles, over a 3-year period. Each year our department drives between 170,000 and 180,000 miles in our service to the community. As a general replacement plan, our vehicles are removed from front line service at about 90-100,000 miles, they are then used in lighter duty service for another 2 years or sold to City Hall for use. This provides for a plan which serves to reduce funds spent on major repairs, allows for extended life in lighter service, and provides for a stronger resale value.

For 2021 the department is electing to purchase to sport utility vehicles (SUV). SUV's are easier on our senior officers for space and exiting and entering the vehicle. There are 3 choices for the coming year; Dodge Durango, Ford Explorer, and Chevrolet Tahoe. The price on the 2021 Tahoe has dropped considerably, at the same time because of its truck platform it provides a longer service life, stronger resale value, and more room for the officers. Currently similarly packaged Ford Police Explorers, and Chevrolet Tahoe's have a difference of \$7,210 in resale value, on Kelly Blue Book the Explorer resells at \$12,990, and the Tahoe at \$20,200. The cost for a 2021 Chevrolet Tahoe on State Bid is \$38,837, our proposal in shifting to the more expensive option is to extend its front-line service life to 110,000 miles making it a break even cost for the City and providing for a strong resale value at the end of its life.

For a comparison on the current SUV's on the State of Minnesota Bid Contract with similar options:

- Dodge Durango V8 - \$34,225
- Ford Explorer V6 - \$34,024
 - The new 3.3 V6 has poor feedback from departments
- Ford Explorer Hybrid - \$37,319
 - The first hybrids came out in 2020, they are complex, and their durability is uncharted, but their future is promising
- Ford Explorer EcoBoost - \$38,062
 - Strong feedback and preferred of the Ford Explorer options, this is a twin turbo V6
- Chevrolet Tahoe - \$38,837

The requested vehicles will be purchased, and delivery taken in the 2021 Budget Year pending final approval of the 2021 City of Big Lake Capitol Improvement Budget. These vehicles will serve as replacements for 1 - 2014 Ford Police Interceptor Explorer currently assigned to Investigations and for 1 – 2016 Ford Police Interceptor Explorer which will be reassigned to City Hall.

We currently spend about \$4,000 to outfit a patrol car, that is the labor and supplies in assembly, not including the equipment. Moving from outfitting every 3 years, to 4 years translates to a savings of \$1,333. Patrol cars function as the offices for our officers, they spend the majority of their 2080 hours a year they work, in their patrol cars. We work diligently to find the best value to accommodate this, this means that it's not always the lowest cost, but the best long term value.

With the auto manufacturing plants out of production for an extended period of time in 2020, it is anticipated that there will be a backlog and delay in delivery of 2021 vehicles. We are making this request in an effort to be at the front of the waiting list for vehicles.

FINANCIAL IMPACT

These items are budgeted in the 2021 Capital Improvement Plan. There will be no budget impact until the 2021 Budget is finalized, and the 2021 Budget Year commences. There is a positive savings in reduced cost per item by locking into a bid at this time.

STAFF RECOMMENDATION

Approve the acceptance of the State bid on these two capitol items.

PUBLIC IMPROVEMENT AGREEMENT

AGREEMENT made this ____ day of _____, 2020, by and between the **CITY OF BIG LAKE**, a Minnesota municipal corporation (“City”) and Debra J Nelson (“Property Owner”).

RECITALS

A. Property Owner is the owner of Lot 4, Block 3, Edgewater Subdivision, Sherburne County, Minnesota, (Parcel ID 65-433-0340) having a street address of 861 Lakeshore Drive, Big Lake, Minnesota (“Subject Property”).

B. The Property Owner has requested that the City repair a defective curb stop to serve the Subject Property (“Public Improvement”).

C. Property Owner has received a quote for the Public Improvement.

NOW, THEREFORE, IN CONSIDERATION OF THEIR MUTUAL COVENANTS, THE PARTIES AGREE AS FOLLOWS:

1. PUBLIC IMPROVEMENT. The City has calculated the cost of the Public Improvement at \$7,550.00 (the “Project Cost”). The City will pay the \$5,550.00 of that cost. The property owner will pay \$2,000 of that cost.

2. WAIVER. The Property Owner waives any and all procedural and substantive objections to the special assessments and to the Public Improvement including but not limited to hearing requirements and any claim that the assessment exceeds the benefit to the Subject Property. The Property Owner waives any appeal rights otherwise available pursuant to Minn. Stat. § 429.081.

3. BINDING EFFECT; RECORDING. This Agreement shall be binding upon the Property Owner and the Property Owner’s successors and assigns. This Agreement shall run with the land and may be recorded against the title to the Subject Property.

4. FULL RELEASE. In consideration for this agreement, the Property Owner indemnifies, holds the City harmless from all liability. City will complete the Public Improvement on the Subject Property, the receipt and sufficiency of which is hereby acknowledged by the Owner, who hereby releases and hold harmless the City, its respective elected officials, employees, agents, contractors, and subcontractors from any and all judgments, claims, causes of action, costs, and damages resulting from or relating to the City’s right of entry, the removal of landscaping, and the installation of replacement landscaping within the Property.

ACTION REQUESTED

By approving this item on the Consent Agenda, Council would be approving Change Order No. 3 to Municipal Builders, Inc. to approve work outside of the Wastewater Treatment Facility Improvement Project contract.

BACKGROUND/DISCUSSION

The project encountered changes that impact the contract amount. The completion date is not changed. All changes were recommended by the Engineering Consultant and found acceptable by City Engineer Otteson. Each of the following items corresponds with the attached Change Order No. 3.

Item No. 1

Update drawings due to wiring changes to screen and booster pump. Screen and booster pump retrofit resulted in making changes on-site. The documentation of these changes are outside the Contract, however they would update City documents providing valuable historical records for future improvements. This is a contract cost **increase** of **\$400.00**.

Item No. 2

Fuel tank removal work resulted in two adjustments. The first adjustment in a cost reduction in testing by utilizing the on-site staff consultant. The second item includes removing and disposal of residuals in the tank – 25 gallons of sludge and 70 gallons of diesel. This net result is a contract cost **decrease** of **\$535.50**.

Item No. 3

Delete the class 5 aggregate base and fabric from under the sidewalk. The sidewalk was designed with aggregate base and fabric to stabilize the underlying soils. However, on-site materials were found to be very suitable for use under the sidewalks without the need for aggregate base and fabric. This is a contract cost **decrease** of **\$510.63**

Item No. 4

Pumping Oxidation Ditch 1 and remove unforeseen sediment. The Contractor was to install the new connecting pipe system by core drilling through the side of the existing Ditch 2 after it drained empty. This required the floor drain to empty the ditch and a slide gate to seal off the connection to the other ditch. However, the floor drain was plugged and the existing slide gate was inoperable and open. This meant the Contractor had to pump down both ditches rather than waiting for 1 to drain. The Contractor responding immediately with pumping equipment and personnel. Once pumped down, significant sand, silt and debris

was found along the wall near the connection location and required removal. The Contractor immediately removed sediment that was obstructing the new connection and then resumed the planned connection. The unforeseen activities of pumping two oxidation ditches and cleaning took an additional day and a half. This is a contract cost **increase of \$3,547.75.**

Item No. 5

Replace existing slide gate in oxidation ditch 2. The existing aluminum slide gate was found to be heavily corroded and parts missing. The gate is about 10 feet below surface and could not be inspected prior to the project. The gate is believed to have been installed in 1980. The function of this slide gate allows staff to isolate and drain down one of the ditches at a time for short term maintenance while allowing the plant to continue operations. Future maintenance will allow structure inspection, maintenance work and sediment removal thereby improving performance. This work includes removal of the existing slide gate assembly and installation of a new **stainless steel** slide gate assembly. It will be anchored to the existing wall using stainless steel bolts and will be identical to the slide gate installed in the new ditch. This is a contract cost **increase of \$8,906.83.**

FINANCIAL IMPACT

The change of work is a net addition of **\$11,808.45** to the project. The Contract amount will be increased to **\$2,380,468.48.** The original contract amount was \$2,357,400.

STAFF RECOMMENDATION

Staff recommends the City Council approve the change in work and revised contract amount. There is no impact to completion date.
